At the outset, the Convener welcomed the members and informed that during the Academic Session 2022-23, no complaint about Ragging of students has been received so far.

The Convener also apprised the members about receipt of the letter No. **D.O. No. F. 1-74/2016 (ARC) dated 14.07.2023** from the UGC, which is suggestive of placing an appropriate mechanism to make the campus free from ragging activities. Members expressed their satisfaction about

the zero ragging incidences on the campus, which is a specialty of our institution and emphasized that the spirit should be maintained in future also.

The Chairman also informed that UGC has revised procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit which has been conveyed vide UGC Letter No. DO F-3-2/2021(ARC) dated 27.10.2021 in pursuance of the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in civil Appeal No. 887/2009. To reduce compliance burden of its stake holders, UGC has revised the procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit.

1. The Revised Procedure is as under:-

Step -I - It is the same like before.

Step-II - The student will receive email with a Registration number and a web link will be provided. He/she will forward the same to the in-charge faculty of the Department. He/she is not required to print & sign the same.

Step-III - The in-charge faculty of the Department will update on the link of any forwarded email which the student has submitted as Anti-Ragging Affidavit/undertaking in the department stating that the student has participated in confidential survey of the UGC. The list will be updated every 24 hours.

2. The email address and contact number of the faculty concerned shall be uploaded on the website and every candidate of the Department would be informed about the revised procedure to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit.
3. As per advice of UGC, the University has created E-admission booklet or brochure, E- leaflets giving details.
4. In the Admission form, the following column may be inserted.

7. Anti-ragging posters are downloaded from the web website and displayed in all the available places including the Boys Hostel and Hostel VIII in appropriate corners where common facilities etc. Mr. V.K. Sharma shall look after the same.

8. Anti-ragging warning has already been prepared in the language prescribed in form No. 10. Constitution of the Anti-Ragging Cell and Anti-ragging squad shall also be prepared and contact details has been completed and has been prepared in various forms which are now uploaded on the university website in compliance of the UGC guidelines including the amendment.

9. Necessary information regarding definition of Ragging and its scope, guidelines and guidelines to the students by the above said teachers during the year 2017-18 has already been prepared & issued to students with the committee (Anti Ragging Cell and Anti Ragging Squad)

10. CCTV cameras have already been installed in the year 2017.

11. Regular instructions and consulting with the students are made in the committee and a sincere effort be made to identify or remove ragging from.

12. Events like Anti Ragging workshop/seminar and quiz events are done to spread the word and arranged.


13. Alarm in the hostel has already been installed. Similarly V.C.A. corridors have been installed there for ensuring safety and security.


14. Students may be informed about Anti Ragging policies through awareness with the students as well as during the seminar/workshop as and when conducted in the committee.

15. Anti-Ragging squad may make surprise inspections of the hostel, common area, boys hostel in some intervals and they may be informed that ragging is a criminal offence and they must follow the guideline issued by the UGC in writing the students of ragging and violation of which would be viewed seriously and cause serious consequences. Students should not engage themselves in any activity of ragging. All stakeholders should try their best to ensure that their respective students study in a fear-free atmosphere.

16. Student members should be vigilant and remain in touch with committee in order to receive the intervals and they may be informed that ragging is a criminal offence and they must follow the guideline issued by the UGC in writing the students of ragging and violation of which would be viewed seriously and cause serious consequences. Students should not engage themselves in any activity of ragging. All stakeholders should try their best to ensure that their respective students study in a fear-free atmosphere.
