ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

Jain Vishva Bharati Institute (Deemed-to-be University), established in 1991 under the inspiration of the revered Jain Acharya Tulsi, is a nationally recognized centre of higher learning committed to excellence in education, ethical values, and the advancement of Indian knowledge systems. Founded with the vision of harmonizing spiritual wisdom with modern academic frameworks, the Institute promotes the ideals of Anekant—encouraging plurality of thought, tolerance, and peaceful coexistence for the welfare of humanity.

The Institution is registered under the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act, 1958 vide Registration No. 43/Nagaur/1991-92 dated 13th November, 2007. The Central Government, through Gazette Notification No. F-9-9/87-43 dated 20th March 1991 and F6-9/87CPP (Desk-C) dated 3rd July 1991 issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, declared Jain Vishva Bharati Institute as a Deemed-to-be University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. The Institute has also been granted recognition under Section 12B of the same Act, enabling it to receive central assistance for development and research. It is a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi, and is accredited with an 'A' Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), affirming its commitment to high standards in academics, research, and institutional governance.

The Institute offers a broad spectrum of undergraduate, postgraduate, doctoral, diploma, and certificate programmes in disciplines including Jainology and Comparative Religion and Philosophy, Sanskrit, Prakrit, Yoga and Science of Living, Nonviolence and Peace, Education, Naturopathy, English, Hindi, Rajasthani and all disciplines at the under-graduate level i.e. Arts, Science & Commerce. Situated in Ladnun, a culturally rich town in Rajasthan and the birthplace of Acharya Tulsi, the Institute's campus provides an ideal academic setting. STATE-OF-THE-ART INFRASTRUCTURE

SMART CLASSROOMS: Classroom are equipped with upgraded tools and techniques, currently the Institute has 20 smart classrooms.

CENTRAL LIBRARY: The Central Library, known as Vardhman Granthagar, houses more than 76,000 books and over 6,600 rare manuscripts. The Institute subscribes to more than 150 journals, 12,000+ e-journals, and a wide range of periodicals. The entire database is computerized and accessible through the SOUL library management system. The library is equipped with internet access and photocopying facilities for student use.

LABORATORIES AND COMPUTER INFRASTRUCTURE: Recognizing the need for experiential learning to prepare students for real-world challenges, the Institute offers a diverse range of experiential and application-based learning laboratories that meet global academic standards.

All academic departments are interconnected through a Local Area Network (LAN), enabling seamless access to shared resources and learning platforms.

DIGITAL REPOSITORY AND DIGITAL RECORDING STUDIO: More than 800 recorded video lectures have been uploaded to the Institute's digital repository, with many more in development. The Digital Studio is fully equipped with advanced technology and is used for the professional recording of audio-visual lectures by subject experts.

HOSTELS: The Institute provides separate 200-bed hostels for girls, located within the campus. These hostels are equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, including secure accommodation, a modern catering system, and air-conditioned rooms available as per requirement. Hostel accommodation is limited and allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Mess facilities are available in the hostels.

MEDICAL COLLEGE AND NATUROPATHY HOSPITAL: The campus hosts a medical centre offering consultancy services in Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Naturopathy, and Physiotherapy. A modern 50-bed Naturopathy Hospital with OPD services has also been established to support both preventive and curative healthcare needs.

YOGA AND MEDITATION CENTRE: To promote holistic development, the Institute has established a Yoga and Meditation Centre equipped with necessary resources to support physical well-being, mental balance, and inner harmony.

AUDITORIUM: The Institute has a well-equipped state-of-the art auditorium to cater to the need of academic and cultural programmes of the institute.

GYMNASIUM: The Institute has a well-equipped gymnasium with all necessary fitness equipment along with a music system. Separate timings and access are maintained for male and female students and staff.

SPORTS FACILITIES: The campus includes facilities for both indoor and outdoor games, encouraging students and staff to participate actively in physical activities and sports events.

CANTEEN: A hygienic and well-equipped canteen is operational within the campus, serving wholesome meals and refreshments to students and staff.

GUEST HOUSE: The Institute has a fully furnished Guest House with quality lodging and boarding facilities for institutional guests and parents of enrolled students.

BANKING SERVICES: Students have access to banking services through the **Punjab National Bank** branch located within the campus premises.

TRANSPORT FACILITIES: Bus services are available for students commuting from nearby regions of Ladnun. Transport is provided against the payment of a vehicle fee.

OPEN THEATRE: The Institute features a spacious and well-designed open theatre within the campus, ideal for hosting cultural programmes, academic events, student performances, and community gatherings.

STUDENT SUPPORT AND ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT INITIATIVES

ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT AND MENTORSHIP: The Alumni Association of Jain Vishva Bharati Institute is open to all current students as well as former graduates contributing across academic and corporate sectors globally. The Institute organizes annual alumni meet to strengthen this network and facilitate mentorship, block placements, training opportunities, and career guidance for current students.

PLACEMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT CELL: The Placement and Career Development Cell plays a key role in bridging the gap between students and the industry and other sectors world. It actively collaborates with industries and organizations to provide placement opportunities to eligible students. The Institute maintains a commendable placement record, with several reputed companies having recruited JVBI graduates in past. Career-readiness workshops and job orientation sessions are also conducted frequently.

INDUSTRY AND INSTITUTIONAL COLLABORATIONS (MOUs): JVBI has signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with several national and international institutions and industries. These agreements facilitate student training, faculty collaboration, academic exchange, internships, research initiatives, and placement support, thereby enhancing the professional ecosystem of the Institute.

EARN WHILE YOU LEARN SCHEME: The Institute encourages self-reliance through its 'Earn While You Learn' scheme, under which students are offered opportunities to develop and utilize their creative skills in practical assignments, supporting both financial and skill-based growth.

STUDY TOURS AND EDUCATIONAL EXPOSURE: To provide practical exposure and contextual understanding of academic subjects, the Institute organizes regular study tours for undergraduate and postgraduate students. These tours enrich their understanding of Indian culture, society, and their application.

STUDENT AND FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES: JVBI has signed collaboration agreements with several renowned national and international universities and institutions to facilitate faculty and student exchanges. These programmes promote teaching, training, and research across diverse academic disciplines.

COACHING SCHEMES FOR SC/ST/OBC AND MINORITY STUDENTS: Under UGC-sponsored schemes, the Institute offers specialized coaching for SC/ST/OBC, minority and female candidates. The objective is to

prepare them for NET/SLET and other competitive examinations, ensuring broader representation in higher education and public service.

CAREER AND COUNSELLING CELL: The Career and Counselling Cell supports students in developing soft skills, communication abilities, and confidence required for competitive exams, internships, and on-the-job performance. The cell also promotes interpersonal skills, ethical values, and social responsibility through lectures by eminent scholars and professionals from academia, government, and industry.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES: Short-term skill development training is offered across departments to enhance employability and industry readiness. These include vocational workshops and hands-on learning experiences aimed at equipping students with practical knowledge.

GUEST LECTURES AND KNOWLEDGE SHARING: The Institute regularly hosts guest lectures by distinguished academicians, professionals, and industry experts to expose students to diverse perspectives and emerging trends in their fields.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEE AND OMBUDSMAN: To ensure transparency and fairness in academic processes, grievances are redressed through Grievance Redressal Committee, however if students are not satisfied they can file their complaints with the Ombudsman who conducts regular hearings and addresses student grievances in a timely and structured manner.

SUMMER PROGRAMMES: JVBI offers short-term academic and value-added courses during the summer break. These programmes provide an opportunity for students to explore additional subjects, enhance skills, and/or engage in research-based learning.

STUDENT INSURANCE FACILITY: The Institute provides group insurance coverage to all enrolled students, offering financial security in the event of any medical emergency or unforeseen circumstances.

STUDENT FEEDBACK AND EXIT MEET: At the conclusion of each programme, departments organize formal Exit Meets with outgoing students. Feedback is collected through a structured questionnaire covering teaching quality, faculty-student interaction, fieldwork support, infrastructure, grievance redressal mechanisms, and student support systems. This feedback plays a vital role in institutional improvement.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC): JVBI proudly hosts a unit of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) under the 3 Raj Girls Battalion, inaugurated on 24th November, 2010. With 54 cadets, this unit instills values of discipline, leadership, character, and national service among students, reflecting the NCC motto: "Unity and Discipline."

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS): The Institute has two NSS units, each comprising 100 student volunteers. Aligned with the motto "Not Me, But You," NSS inculcates the spirit of voluntary service, community engagement, and responsible citizenship among students through various social outreach activities.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020): From the academic session 2023–24, the Institute has adopted the National Education Policy 2020 as per UGC guidelines. Key features include the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), flexible course structures, credit transfer mechanisms, and multiple entry-exit options—empowering students to pursue interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary education.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC): JVBI has made the Academic Bank of Credit fully functional. As of now, over 23,189 degrees and 44,348 mark sheets have been successfully uploaded on the ABC platform, facilitating digital credit storage, mobility, and academic recognition at the national level.

STIPEND AND SCHOLARSHIPS:

AT THE POST GRADUATE LEVEL: Department of Jainology and Comparative Religion and Philosophy, Prakrit and Sanskrit provide free hostel and Rs. 3000/- per month in lieu of meal facilities. The Department of Non-violence and Peace provides need cum merit based scholarship (to be decided by the Vice Chancellor) for 10 months only, maximum for four students of each year.

AT POST GRADUATE LEVEL AND UNDER GRADUATE LEVEL: A limited number of merit-cum-need based scholarships are available for deserving students.

The students belonging to SC/ST/OBC are provided assistance and guidance to avail scholarship from Social Welfare Department as per State Govt. norms. The students can also avail the Post-Graduate Merit Scholarship Scheme for university under graduate 'Rank Holders' and other Scholarships under UGC Scheme as per UGC guidelines and norms.

FEE EXEMPTION POLICY:

Fee exemption is available to students who are economically weak but are meritorious as per the rules of the Institute.

- Note:** (i) 50% concession in Tuition fee in the Regular Programme and 50% concession in Programme Fee in the Distance Programme shall be granted to the spouse and two dependent children of the regular staff members of the JVBI. No concession will be given to staff member for his/her own study.
- (ii) 25% concession in Tuition fee in the Regular Programme and 25% concession in the Programme fee in the Distance Programme shall be granted to the spouse and two dependent children of the regular staff members of JVB.
- (iii) Sadhus/Sadhvis/Saman/Samanis/Mumukshu etc., who have renounced the worldly possessions are exempted from paying any kind of fee.
- (iv) No concession is given in Ph.D programme and other professional courses.
- (v) The Institute reserves the right to revise the fees, etc., from time to time.
- (vi) If a student secured 91% to 100% marks in class 12th she will be given 100% merit based discount on the tuition fee in first semester. The discount will continue in coming semesters if percentage criteria are maintained in the semester end examination result throughout all the semesters.
- (vii) If a student secured 80% to 90% marks in class 12th she will be given 50% merit based discount on the tuition fee in first semester. The discount will continue in coming semesters if percentage criteria are maintained in the semester end examination result throughout all the semesters.

Note : This merit-based waiver shall continue in subsequent Semester only if the student maintains equivalent academic performance as per the University standard.

FEE REFUND POLICY:

In the event of a student/candidate found ineligible or withdrawing before the commencement of the programme, the waiting list candidate(s) shall be granted admission against a vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs. 1000/- (one thousand only) shall be refunded to the student/candidate.

The details of the fee refund policy are given below:

- 100% Fee will be refunded, if withdrawal request is received 15 days or more before last date of admission.
- 90% Fee will be refunded, if withdrawal request is received less than 15 days before last date of admission.
- 80% Fee will be refunded, if withdrawal request is received 15 days or less after last date of admission.
- 50% Fee will be refunded, if withdrawal request is received 30 days or less but more than 15 days after last date of admission.
- 0% Fee will be refunded, if withdrawal request is received more than 30 days after last date of admission.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENT FOR RUNNING A PROGRAMME:

The commencement of a regular programme or any subject is subject to the enrolment of a minimum number of students. If the admission in a particular programme/subject is less than 5 in PG programme and less than 10 in UG Programme/subject, the said programme/subject shall not run, except in case of two programmes of studies i.e. Prakrit and Sanskrit, where the minimum number of candidates shall be five (5). In English (P.G.) the minimum number of students shall not be less than 15, otherwise admission in such programme may be put in abeyance. The decision of the competent authority shall be final.

INTRODUCTION OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM AND CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS:

From the session 2015-2016 onwards the Choice Based Credit System has been introduced.

The Institute reserves the right to rename any programme, make variations in the contents and methods of delivery of courses and other services, to discontinue Programmes or courses and other services and to merge or combine Programmes or courses, if such action is reasonably considered to be necessary.

All students will be required as a condition of enrolment to agree and abide by and to submit to the procedures of the Institute's regulations as amended from time to time.

PROVIDING THE FACILITY OF MOOCs

The Institute has made available the students the facility of MOOCs courses and has given options among many subjects taught through SWAYAM portal of Govt. of India. The credits earned through SWAYAM are included in Grade Card of a student leading to a degree as per the guidelines of Govt. of India.

- Step - 5 Fill in the basic Information, Choose the Programme and Course, and upload required documents—

Note: Original Migration, Transfer Certificate, Minority, Caste Certificate should be deposited in concerned department.

- Step - 6 After paying the fee Rs. 500/-, a final submit button will be displayed on the screen.
The Application Fee once paid is non-refundable and no further correspondence in this regard will be entertained.

- Incomplete applications shall be summarily rejected.
- Candidate, whose result has not been declared, may also apply for admission provided they produce the result/ certificate of the qualifying examination by the last date of admission.
- The last dates for acceptance of application forms for each programme are specified in Academic Calendar.
- Those satisfying the eligibility requirements will have to appear in written test. Interview for all the programme will be conducted in Institute (As per the date provided in Academic Calendar).
- Attendance in a 3-6 days Personality Development Camp (Orientation Programme) is mandatory to all the admitted students in Semester-I. Those who will not complete this programme their admission shall automatically be cancelled.
- The list of the candidates selected for interview after passing written test shall be displayed in order of their Entrance Test Roll No. on the Notice Board of the Faculty/Department / Centre concerned as well as on the JVBI's website on the dates given in the admission schedule.
- In all programme admission will be made on the basis of academic merit along with the marks obtained in written test and performance at interview.

RULES REGARDING ADMISSION:

- All the selected candidates are required to submit Transfer Certificate/Migration Certificate in original at the time of admission on or before 15th October, 2026, if not submitted earlier along with admission form and with late fee of Rs. 250/- upto 31.10.2026 and Rs. 500/- upto 07.11.2026.

- If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, he/she shall automatically forfeit his/her right to admission.
- The Institute reserves the right to refuse admission in any individual case without assigning any reason.
- No candidate will be allowed to take up a full time employment while pursuing a full time course. Those who are employed at the time of admission will be required to produce a certificate of leave from their employer within one month of the date of admission, failing which their admission will be automatically cancelled.
- A student of Semester-I of any course who is detained due to shortage of attendance will no longer remain the student of the Institute. Such students will have to seek fresh admission and will be required to go through the entire admission process again.
- A student of semester other than Semester-I of any course, who has not appeared in examinations due to shortage of attendance, may be granted re-admission in the same class of that course against payment of fee for that semester. In case, he/she fails to fulfill the requirement of attendance after being given re-admission he/she shall not be given another chance.
- Fresh admission to the new course will be granted to only those candidates whose results of the qualifying examinations are completed in all respect by the last date of admission as per the list in which the name of the student figures.
- ***The re-admission shall be effected as per norms by paying Rs 2500 as a fine. If the name of the student is struck off on any other grounds the same fee of re-admission would be applicable to him/her also. In case of a blank semester in core B.Ed./M.Ed./B.A.-B.Ed./B.Sc.-B.Ed., Re-admission fee will be 50% of the total fee (as per government rules). Blank Semester means that semester, where student has not attempted/appeared in any paper in the examination. However, if a student attempted/appeared in any paper in the examination during a semester, that semester will not be called a blank semester.***

RESERVATION OF SEATS:

Reservation of Seats will be as per Norms of Rajasthan Government.

ATTENDANCE:

- Students shall be required to be regular in their classes and attend not less than 75% of the aggregate of lectures/ tutorials/ practicals of all compulsory/ optional/ honours and subsidiary subjects in order to be eligible to appear in the annual/semester examinations. Any student having less than 75% attendance shall not be allowed to appear in the written examination.
- Attendance of the students shall be counted from the date of admission in the respective programme.
- If a student is found to be continuously absent from the class without any information for a period of 7 days or more his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls.
- Request for relaxation in attendance on account of participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S., Institute Sports and other activities organized by the Institute must be sent to the Head of the Department/Principal within 15 days of the function/activity through respective incharge.
- However, shortfall of 5% attendance can be condoned by the Head of the Department /Principal on account of sickness provided the student submits a sickness and fitness certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner within seven days from recovery or on account of any other extenuating circumstances supported by documentary evidence. The conduct of the student must be satisfactory. Condonation upto another 5%, may be considered by the Vice Chancellor on account of any other circumstances provided that the request is duly supported by documentary evidence and strongly recommended by the HOD/Principal concerned.

RE-ADMISSION:

- If a student remains absent for seven consecutive days without leave/permission, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls by the Department concerned and it will be conveyed to the office of the competent authority on the same day or latest by the next day. Such students may, however, apply to the Vice-Chancellor through Head of the Department/ Principal for re-admission within 7 days of the date of issuance of notice.
- The re-admission shall be effected as per norms by paying Rs. 2500/- (Two thousand five hundred) as a fine. If the name of the student is struck off on any other ground the same fee of re-admission would be applicable to him/her also.
- In case of blank semester in core B.Ed./M.Ed./B.A.-B.Ed./B.Sc.-B.Ed., Re-admission fee will be 50% of the total fee (as per government rules).
- If the name of student is struck off from B.A./B.Com/B.Sc. in case of fail or dropout, 50% of total fees will be charged as re-admission fee if she has deposited the fee previously. If she has not deposited the fees earlier she has to deposit full fee.

ADMISSION TO HOSTEL:

- The students, desirous to be admitted in the hostels, should contact Chief Warden of the Institute for admission formalities.
- Students willing to stay in Air-Conditioned Rooms in the hostel should apply to the Chief Warden and the same will be allotted provided after depositing requisite fee meant for Air-conditioned rooms. Air-conditioned rooms will be provided on first come first served basis as per availability of rooms in Hostel.
- Students admitted in hostel are required to pay prescribed full fee (from academic year) in advance. The hostel residents are required to follow hostel rules strictly.
- No hostel facility is provided to Boys, part-time students and distance mode students.
- Hostel security will be refunded at the time of leaving the Institute on producing 'No Dues certificates' from the sections concerned & original receipt of security paid.
- Information regarding hostel fee is given under the head of fee structure (Mentioned at page no. 77).
- All the hostellers are required to wear Identity card of the hostel issued by the Institute in the campus.
- Any violation of hostel bye laws by a hosteller will be liable to disciplinary action.
- Relatives/parents/guardians as mentioned in the admission form will only be allowed to meet the hostellers during day time.
- Relatives/parents/guardians are not allowed to stay in the hostel.

RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING CARE OF EQUIPMENTS:

- Equipments will be issued by the Store Incharge to the students on due authorization by the Head of the department concerned.
- Each student, to whom equipment has been issued, will have to sign on a receipt.
- Any physical damage to equipments will be the direct responsibility of the students/group of students in whose name equipments are issued.
- Students returning the equipment after the due date will be charged late fee.
- Students must immediately inform the maintenance staff and teacher, of any defects they experience while handling the equipments.
- If a student loses or damages equipment issued to him or her, he or she should immediately inform the office through their Head of the department i.e. Stores/Faculty/ Administration giving full details of circumstances leading to the loss or damage of equipment.

- Student who has lost or damaged the equipment will be required to replace it within reasonable time, the identical piece(s) or part of the equipment or pay the current market value of the equipment.
- In case of damage or loss of any equipment by students working in a group, the fine will be levied collectively on the assigned group. At the time of admission an undertaking will also be taken from the student to this effect.

STUDENT'S DISCIPLINE:

- Every student should maintain the discipline of Institute.
- No student is allowed to visit places or areas declared by the competent authority as "Out of Bounds" for the students.
- Every student is required to carry his / her Identity Card issued by the competent authority. Every student, who has been issued the Identity Card shall have to produce or surrender the Identity Card, as and when required by the Proctorial Staff, Teaching and Library Staff and the Officials of the Institute.
- Any student found guilty of impersonation or of giving a false name or found guilty of forgery shall be liable to disciplinary action.
- The loss of the Identity Card, whenever it occurs, shall immediately be reported in writing to the Competent Authority. New Identity card will be provided after charging penalty of Rs. 100/-.

PROHIBITION AND PUNISHMENT FOR HARASSMENT AND RAGGING:

ANTI-RAGGING CELL: Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the Institute, in the premises of the Hostel or in rented quarters outside the campus and any part of JVBI system as well.

What Constitutes Ragging: The Institute has adopted UGC guidelines framed on the basis of Lyngdoh Committee. In the light of the guidelines, Ragging shall constitute any one or more of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual harassment or abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post or public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- j) The student is required to submit online undertaking/affidavit in each academic year on website www.antiragging.in and www.amanmakement and forward e-mail received with his/her registration number and a weblink to the Nodal Officer of the Department/College. The list will be updated every 24 hours. Anti-Ragging undertaking reference no. is to be mentioned in the admission form.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING: The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take appropriate action, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established by Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:
 - a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - d) Withholding result.
 - e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - g) Cancellation of admission.
 - h) Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarment from getting admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall be, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor, (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the Institution, as the case may be.
- Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faculty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.

ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL:

As a part of the Policy against Sexual Harassment, JVBI seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment, free of sexual harassment for students, academic and non-teaching staff. This will also apply to outsiders and residents, on the JVBI campus.

All complaints of ragging and sexual harassment would be heard and redressed by the Committee, framed for the purpose from time to time by the Vice-Chancellor of the Institute and in accordance with the rules framed for the purpose.

BREACH OF DISCIPLINE INCLUDES:

- Use of Non-vegetarian food items, smoking, tobacco, drugs and any intoxicants including alcohol and alcoholic product.
- Irregularity in attendance.
- Causing disturbance to classes, offices, libraries, auditoriums, play grounds etc.
- Misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind at the time of meetings, during curricular or extra-curricular activities of the Institute.
- Misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind at the examination centre.
- Misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind towards a teacher or any employee of the Institute or any visitor to the Institute.
- Causing damage to the property of the Institute.
- Giving publicity to misleading accounts or rumours amongst the students.
- Refusing to produce or surrender the Identity Card as and when asked by competent authority and other staff of the Institute.
- Students found guilty of breach of discipline shall be liable to punishment, as fine, campus ban, expulsion or rustication.
- All powers related to students discipline and disciplinary action vest with the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. However, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or any of his/her powers as he/she deems proper to the other competent authority, of the Institute.

AWARD OF DEGREE:

- The students who successfully complete the programmes of study will be awarded degrees at the Convocation. If the convocation is not organized, then degrees will be distributed from the counter after its approval by the concerned statutory body.
- **The Examination Results of each semester will be displayed on the website of Institute <http://nad.digilocker.gov.in> The detailed grade card of each Semester will also be displayed on website, consolidated marks card will be issued after completion of programme. The students may download their marks card for re-evaluation purposes etc.**

A student can pursue two full time academic programmes in physical mode, provided that in such cases, class timings for one programme do not overlap with the class timings of the other programme. Similarly, a student can pursue two academic programmes, one in full time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or up to two ODL/Online programmes simultaneously.

Process for Department-wise Registration of JVBI Students on the SWAYAM Portal involves following steps:

Department-Wise Registration on SWAYAM Portal

1. Identification of Courses:

Departments at JVBI shall identify suitable courses on the SWAYAM portal relevant to their curriculum.

2. Registration Coordination:

Each department shall appoint a faculty member or coordinator responsible for overseeing the registration process.

3. Student Awareness:

An orientation sessions or workshop shall be conducted to educate students about the SWAYAM platform, its benefits, and the registration process.

4. Registration Period:

A registration period will be scheduled during which students can enroll in SWAYAM courses identified by their respective departments.

5. Registration Process:

Students shall visit the SWAYAM portal and create an account if they don't have one already.

They browse through the listed courses under their department's recommendations.

Students shall select the desired courses and complete the registration process.

6. Confirmation and Monitoring:

Departments receive confirmation of student registrations.

Regularly monitor student progress and engagement with SWAYAM courses.

7. Examination Process & Fee

- Exam will be held as per schedule on Swayam Portal.
- However, if a student wants to appear at JVBI, examination will be conducted as per JVBI schedule, along with semester exam and a nominal examination fee will be charged for the same, as decided by the Institute.
- No, extra fee will be charged.

8. Feedback Mechanism:

Establish a feedback mechanism for students to provide input on the registered courses and their experience on the SWAYAM platform.

Student Credit Transfer Policy

1. Evaluation of SWAYAM Courses:

Departments evaluate SWAYAM courses based on their alignment with JVBI's curriculum, learning outcomes, and academic rigor.

2. Credit Equivalency:

Determine the credit equivalency for each SWAYAM course based on factors such as course duration, depth of content, assessments, and alignment with JVBI's courses.

3. Credit Transfer Process:

Students shall complete SWAYAM courses and achieve the required passing grades.

They shall submit certificates or transcripts of completed SWAYAM courses to the department for evaluation.

4. Credit Transfer Evaluation:

The department reviews the submitted documents to ensure they meet the criteria for credit transfer.

If approved, the equivalent credits are transferred to the student's academic record at JVBI.

The transferred credits shall contribute towards the completion of the student's degree requirements.

5. Policy Review:

Credit transfer policy shall be periodically reviewed to ensure alignment with academic standards, SWAYAM course offerings, and institutional requirements.

This process ensures seamless department-wise registration of JVBI students on the SWAYAM portal to establish a clear policy for credit transfer based on completed SWAYAM courses.

यातायात सुविधा (वार्षिक)
